During lesson 1 Nelson and Victory will do the run. (Mary Rose and Warrior in assembly).

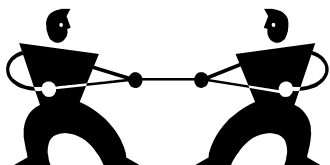
Lesson 2 Warrior and Mary Rose will do the run.

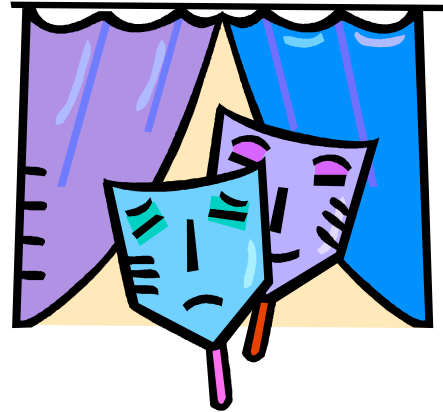
